19.07.03	<p><u>Public Participation and Presentations</u> (Questions and/or statements)</p> <p>Two issues were raised by a member of the Footpath Club:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. the proposed extension at the Football Club would have an effect on FP 14 that ran alongside the current pavilion and this had not been raised by the PC in response to the application. The Clerk indicated that the FP actually ran in an arc away from the pavilion (across the current position of the pitch, but this was going to change as the pitch was moving away from the pavilion towards the river. Location of the actual route would be made available for information. The impact of the application was however noted for future reference. b. Recent planning applications for Place Farm both indicated that a footway for those working at the site should be constructed prior to the development taking place. In response it was explained that the PC was aware of this and was working with the Fonthill Estate on a project that would provide the footway, but that there was a land ownership issue and Wiltshire Council were involved. <p>P.Cnllr Murray (a School Governor) also spoke to draw everyone’s attention to the recent OfSTED report for St John’s Primary School that was now graded ‘GOOD’. The Parish was urged to respond positively to the Footpath Gates initiative launched by the Area Board and asked to note that Nick Cowen would be retiring at the end of August. 5. The Housing Needs Survey was still not finalized.
