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Minutes of Full Meeting Tuesday 4th February 2020 at 7pm

Questions or Statements: up to 3 members of the public were present.

a. Two members of Wiltshire Police attended the meeting to provide an update on changes to policing in the local area: Officers Sergeant Kevin Harnsworth (Warminster, Westbury, Tisbury & Mere) and Richard Salter (Neighbourhood PC & Wildlife Crime). Rural crime was one (of three) of the current priorities of the team, with emphasis on communication with the public at drop-in sessions/being visible on the High Street, information gathering and the potential for raising awareness on What's on in Tisbury Facebook page. There was a brief discussion on the perceived spate of burglaries in Tisbury.

Report from Residents' Representative re 20mph speed limit extension: 3 main issues mentioned.

- a. progress with the 20mph extension initiative will be explored by the Tisbury and West Tisbury Clerks with the CATG Highways Officer on 12th February. Any proposals will be discussed at a Traffic Committee in March, reported at the following Parish Council meeting, before reporting to CATG.
- b. No further CSW sessions are scheduled (due to continuing lack of ID cards) and a morale boost definitely required for those volunteers trained (since October) but with no ID.
- c. No Police Officers had attended any CSW sessions although part of the overall process and a presence would be appreciated by the volunteers.
- d. The Police Officers were asked to note points b. and c. and Sergeant Harnsworth requested that a CSW schedule be forwarded to him when next available.
- e. P.Cnllrs were invited to attend future sessions too to give a 'pat on the back' to volunteers.

Note: the Clerk would circulate CSW rotas to Cnllrs in the future.

Report from Wiltshire Councillor: P.Cnllrs were made aware of six matters.

- a. The theme at the Area Board meeting on 26th January had centred on Mental Health issues for young people and had been very informative.
- b. A grant was awarded to build a barn structure on the Wilton Estate that would benefit a wide range of individuals including adults who have a learning difficulty, people who have autism and adults with emotional ill health.
- c. Speeding it seemed likely that the Police would be pressured in to enabling more enforcement in the future.
- d. Cleveland House the call-in had been requested, but the application had been withdrawn.
- e. Affordable Housing at Former Sports Centre at a recent meeting with Wiltshire Council (WC), Senior Officers had indicated that a planning application for free-market housing would be submitted contrary to the recently made Neighbourhood Plan.
- f. Nadder Centre planning application for change of use to extend office/administrative use (Class B1(a)) throughout the building at a recent meeting of the Nadder Centre Board, Wiltshire Council Officers made it very clear that there was no money available to fulfill a planning obligation to demolish the former Sports Centre. This led to speculation that the site would be allowed to deteriorate and that this would inevitably lead to safeguarding issues for the local school, pre-school and also local residents due to the use by vagrants, drug users and vermin.

Potential adult outdoor gym in the Recreation Ground – resident not present; apologies given.

P.Cnllrs resolved not to re-consider this application for the following reasons: • Missing information in section 24 – i.e lack of transparency, and • Lack of progress with the demolition of the former sports centre on adjacent land that has outstanding planning approval (19/03260/VAR) and refers to protection of sites for House Martins and retaining/enhancing the biodiversity - section 12 makes no mention of this.
